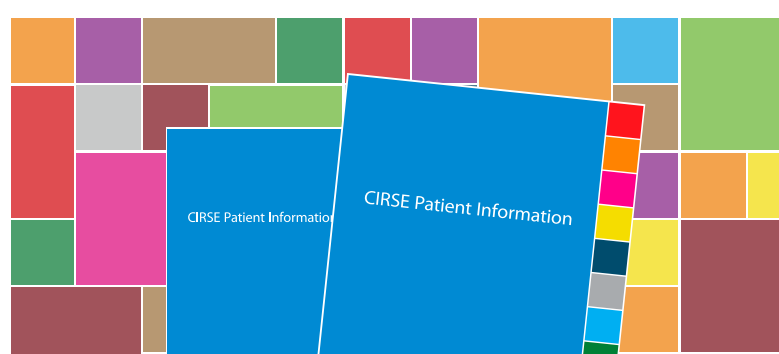
Free webinar on investigator-initiated studies
