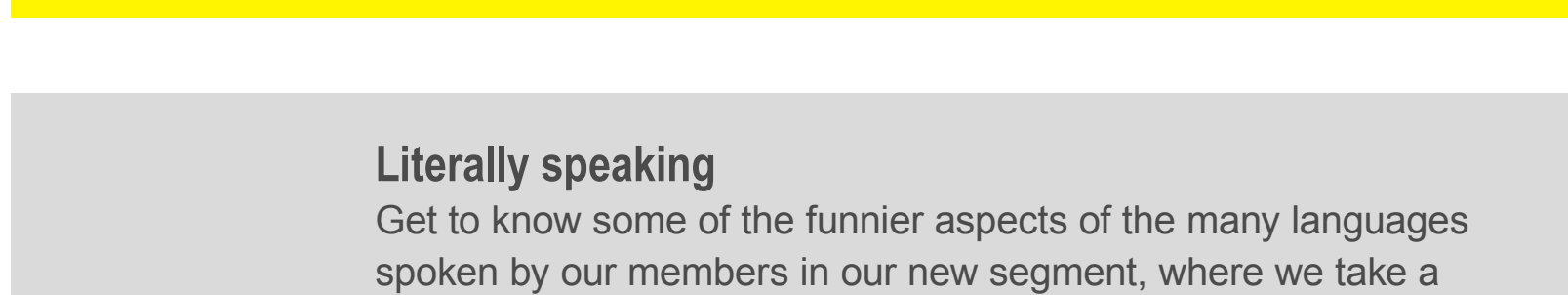
New open-access funding agreements

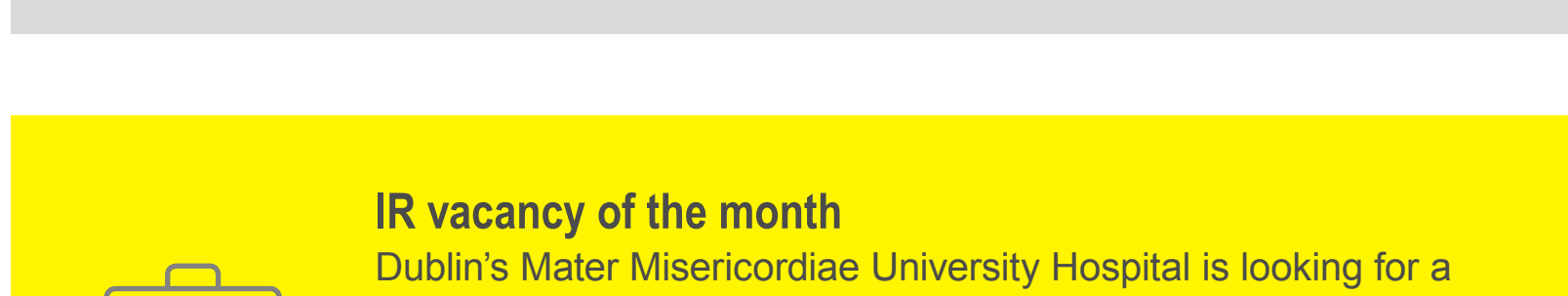


Literally speaking

Get to know some of the funnier aspects of the many languages spoken by our members in our new segment, where we take a proverb from somewhere in the world and translate it word for word into English.

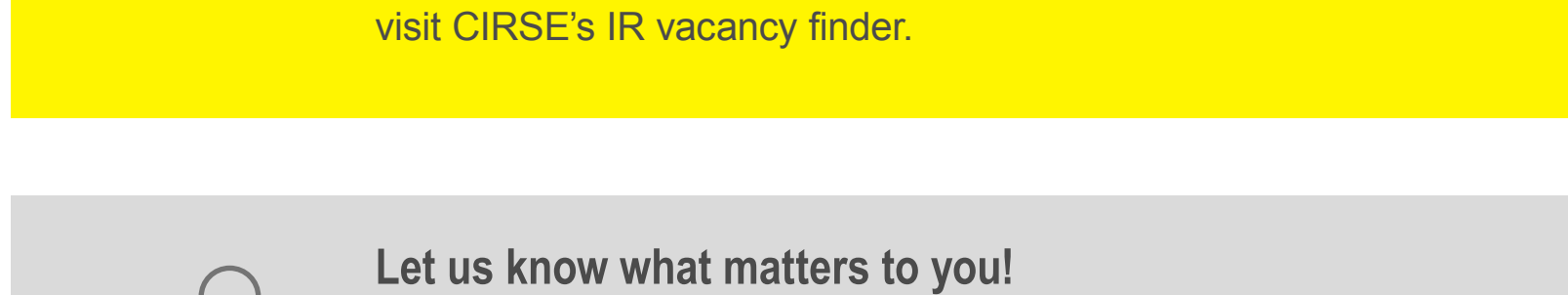

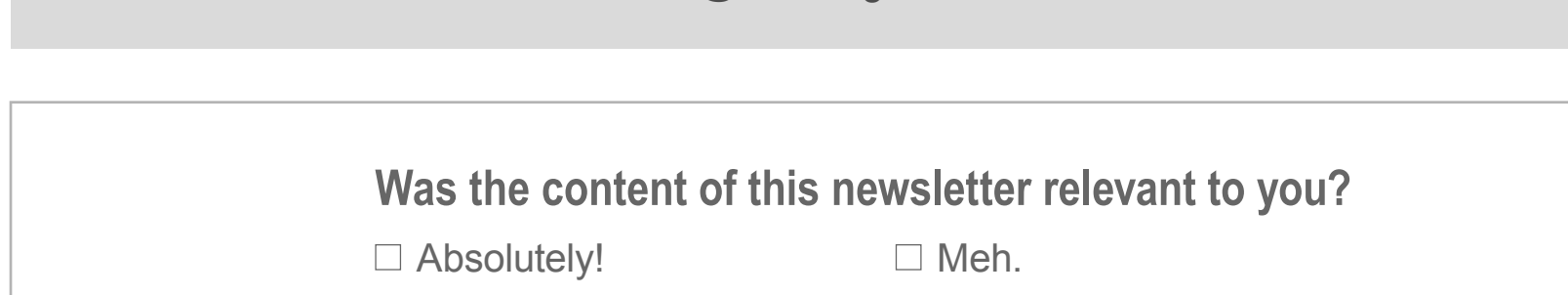
IR vacancy of the month

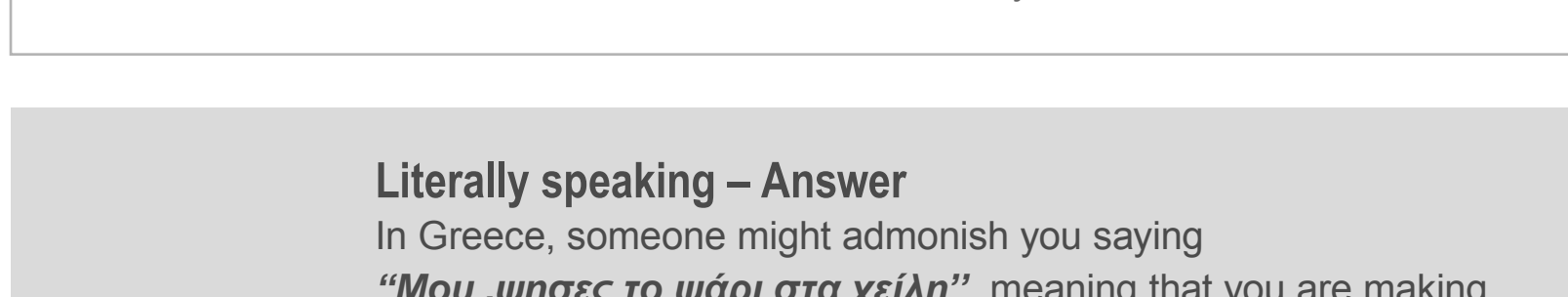
